Club Rules and Regulations

Shooting Hours 9 am to Dusk

General

- All N.H. State and Federal laws must be adhered to.
- Absolutely No Alcohol or Elicit Drugs are allowed on the premises.
- Everyone is responsible for practicing safe gun handling and knowing the safe operation of the firearm they are using.
- Everyone is responsible for knowing and following the rules and regulations set forth by the GCF&GA.
- Any action that endangers others or club property is grounds for immediate termination of your membership.
- All shooters will clean up their Trash, Brass and Targets when done shooting.
- Any unlawful act witnessed shall be reported to the local police immediately.
- Any injuries that occur on GCF&GA property will be reported to a Club Officer as soon as possible.
- No minors are allowed on GCF&GA Property without adult supervision.
- Members are urged to report to a club Officer of any violators of club rules and regulations.

Membership and Guest

- The membership year will begin at the Annual May Meeting. At the end of the Annual meeting the combination to the entry gate will be changed. You can be issued your membership card with the new combination at the meeting once your dues are paid. Early renewals are appreciated!
- Members may bring non-member guest to shoot. Any individual may be your guest two times but must join the club after that.
- All guest MUST sign a waiver and place it in the lock box located at the gate prior to shooting.
- Member's immediate family are considered Associate Members, (spouse and children under the age of 18). There is no limit to the number of times associate members may shoot but a member must accompany them each time.
- Any member in good standing that is called to active Military duty for more than 6 months, will be considered a member in good standing for the duration of their service to the United States of America. Once they return from active duty they will renew their membership the next May.

Gate Combination

- When club events are ongoing, the gate will be open and the lock will NOT be present. Be aware that the gate will be locked at the close of the event.
- At any time other than organized club events, the gate must be kept closed and locked. Lock it immediately after you enter and do NOT leave it open for someone that will arrive later.
- All members have the right to ask to see your membership card or some form of identification.
- DO NOT give anyone the combination to the entry gate, This is grounds for immediate termination of your membership.

General Range Rules

- Eye and Ear protection must be worn by everyone in the shooting areas.
- NO aerial or exploding targets allowed (Exception / Shotgun Clay targets)
- Police your brass, trash and targets.
- Anyone may call a "Cease-Fire" for any safety reason.

General Range Rules Cont.

- Once a Cease Fire has been called ALL Firearms will be made safe, Actions open and shooting stopped until the range is declared safe to shoot.
- No one will go down range until the entire firing line is made safe. Firearms unloaded, actions open and No handling of firearms while anyone is down range.
- Anyone acting in the capacity of Certified Range Safety Officer (RSO) will not be actively shooting

Rifle Range

- All shooting must be done from the covered firing line positions unless there is a Certified RSO (Certified Range Safety Officer) on site.
- All targets must be placed at least 1 foot above the range floor and at least 1 foot below the top of the berm.
- Your projectile must strike the berm.
- No targets will be hung from the structure of the bullet trap at the 100 yard line.
- Due to safety, shooting 50 BMG Caliber, anti-tank and alike are not allowed.
- Do not fire at sharp angles across the range.
- No full automatic rifles shooting without suppressors.
- No full automatic / sub-machine guns without suppressors on weekends or major holidays.

Small Bore Range

- Only Rim Fire ammunition and firearms will be allowed on the small bore range.
- All targets must be placed at least 1 foot from the range floor and at least 1 foot below the top of the berm.
- Your projectile must strike the berm.
- Rim fire Handguns and Rifles Only.

Shotgun Range

- Only Shotguns are allowed on the shotgun Range. No shot larger than 7 ½ allowed except #2 lead or T steel to be used on the pattering board. Positively No handguns or Rifles on the shotgun range.
- All shotguns are to be kept unloaded with actions open until the shooter is on the shooting station, muzzles will be pointed down range and targets prepared for launching.
- No shooter will turn around or leave the shooting station without first opening the action and removing all shells.
- All shotguns will be carried by the shooter with the muzzle pointed in a safe direction, forward and down is the preferred carry.
- No one will be forward of the firing line while there is active shooting.

Handgun Range

- Only straight-wall standard handgun ammunition will be used on the handgun range. All handguns using Rifle ammunition will be shot on the rifle range following the rifle range rules. (.410 handgun exception)
- Any other exceptions for ammunition, An RSO must approve and be on site.
- All targets must be placed at least 1 foot above the range floor and at least 1 foot below the top of the berm.
- No targets will be hung on the structures of the bullet traps.
- All projectiles must hit inside the bullet traps.
- The shooting tree will NOT be removed from the designed structure.
- At no time will any cross fire be allowed.

Archery Range

- Archery is not limited to the 9 am shooting rule.
- No broad head arrow tips are allowed on the archery range or used on the practice butts or any of the targets on the 3-D course.
- Absolutely no firearm shooting on the archery range or the 3-D course.
